



Common Mullein is a biennial plant that produces a large rosette in the first year with a stout stem that shoots up to 6' tall flowering the second year. The leaves are quite soft and fuzzy and the flowers which are yellow have an appearance almost like a corn cob. This native of Asia was introduced from Europe and while common in temperate regions of North America has become quite prolific in Colorado. It produces large amounts of seeds and even though it only reproduces from seed occurring June to August this plant significantly reduces forage as livestock and wildlife will not eat it due to its wooly leaves.
